FORMAL PROGRAM – 2.30 to 3.30 pm – Main Auditorium

The formal program includes a photographic exhibition and presentations honouring the life of Nina Skoroszewska, who was a Polish Australian social worker, multicultural activist and a founder of the Polish Welfare Bureau in the 1970s (now PAWA Community Care).

Folk dancing and music featuring local Polish folkloric dance ensemble Syrenka and a musical performance by renowned pianist Gregory Kinda and singer Marta Nowicka.

Speakers - A number of speakers will talk about Nina Skoroszewska, her work in the past and link to the present role of PAWA Community Care, and the value of recording Sydney's Polish Australian community and family histories. Winners of our Youth Art competition will also be announced.
